STRUCTURAL ANALYSIS TO BEGIN

The Whiteside Theatre Foundation has engaged a local company to do our Structural Analysis. This is a professional engineering report to let us know what needs to be done to the theatre to open the doors. This work will be carried out in May and June, with the final report due by August 2010.

With this part of the rehabilitation started, we are focusing on the next “scene” in our three-Act plan, the Waterworks project. Many people are aware that the Whiteside was closed due to a broken sewer. The Waterworks project will raise money to fix the sewer line, and restore the original

public restrooms to working order. All of our present efforts are geared towards raising matching funds for grants that the Whiteside Theatre Foundation received for this purpose. We are currently gathering information and doing assessments to guide the decisions on the repairs, developing cost estimates, and identifying all of the options.

WHITESIDE JAM

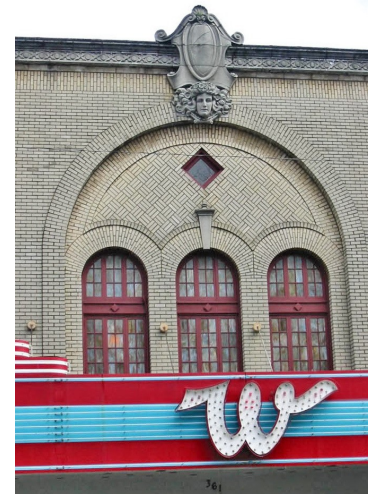
